A Reflection from the desk of the Pastor

Eighth Sunday in Ordinary Time

February 27, 2022

Year C


It is very easy for us to point out the faults of others while being oblivious of our own faults. In fact, we tend to discuss and expose the faults of others while being reluctant to admit that we may even be guilty of the same issues. Jesus poses a question to his disciples. He asks, rhetorically, why his disciples would notice the splinter in their brothers' eye when they had not noticed the wooden beams in their own eyes. In this statement, Jesus is not ruling out the possibility of fraternal correction. Instead, He is condemning the hypocrisy of those who, like the Pharisees, are quick to point out the faults of others which are minor in comparison with their own faults. They are called to take care of their own faults before they point out the faults of others. Are we guilty of pointing out other people's faults while ignoring ours?

In the second part of the gospel, Jesus states that each tree is known by its fruit. This is a practically relevant image that the disciples can relate with. We can easily identify a tree by its fruits. In applying this image to ourselves, we must ask ourselves what kind of fruit we bear. Last Sunday, I referenced a quote from Acts 11: 26 which stated that the disciples were first called Christians in Antioch. There must be something in their behavior that caused them to be identified as followers of Christ. Are there aspects of our behavior that identifies us as Christians? How do other people describe our behavior and practices?

Bishop McGovern was grateful for the opportunity to visit with us a couple weeks ago. He has expressed a desire to return probably during Lent for a discussion on some pastoral topics. We are working to identify a date when we can invite the Bishop back to the parish. Sincere thanks to all who helped in preparing for the Bishop's visit.

**Lenten Abstinence and Fasting
Regulations**

Everyone 14 years of age or older is bound to **abstain from meat** (and items made with meat) on **Ash Wednesday, all the Fridays of Lent and Good Friday.**

Everyone 18 or older, and under 59 years of age, is bound to **fast** on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Only one full meatless meal is allowed. Two other meatless meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to each one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted. When health or ability to work would be seriously affected, the law does not oblige. Catholics should not lightly excuse themselves from these prescribed minimal penitential practices. 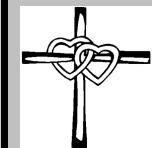

Gracious God, You have called us through Baptism to discipleship, believing in your Son, Jesus Christ, who has sent us to bring the Good News of salvation to the world.

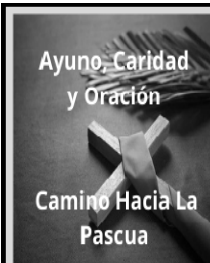

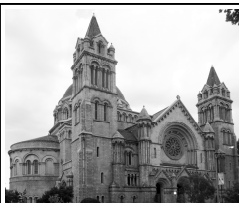
