## *A Reflection from the desk of the Pastor*

**The Second Sunday in Ordinary Time**

**January 16, 2022**

**Year C**

Have you ever wondered about how the various parts of the body work in unison to keep functioning properly? In the second reading from the first letter to the Corinthians, St. Paul speaks of a variety of gifts, but always the same spirit. The Corinthians were a troubled, but thriving port-town of Southern Greece. It appears that some of the members of the Corinthian community valued their individual gifts so much that they considered the gifts of others to be insignificant. Paul emphasizes the variety of gifts and the fact that all these gifts derive from the same spirit. In every community, there are a variety of gifts that are bestowed to each individual according to God's magnanimity. Some of these gifts may be more or less spectacular (or obvious) than the other. However, this does not imply that any of these gifts has a diminished value. What is most important for each one to realize is that his or her gift plays a role in the smooth functioning of the community. It is similar to the different parts of the body working together to keep the body in equilibrium. While some parts of the body are more obvious and appear to work harder, other parts are less obvious, work in the background, but are no less important. When one attends a ball game at the stadium, it is easy to think of the players as the most important part of the equation. However, there are several others (match officials, security personnel, cleaning staff, valets, servers, concession stand caterers, etc.) without those services your experience at the game would not be possible. Everyone has a role to play. What is my role in my community? Am I fulfilling that role each day? Do I sometimes think that my role is more important than the other person's role?

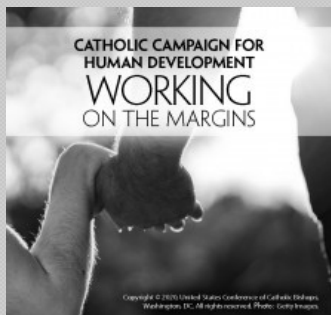

**Sacred Heart has a total of 98 households with a target donation goal of \$3,921. So far 19 household have donated a total of \$2,304.**

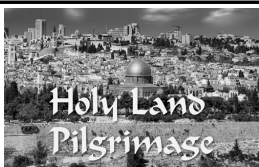
