A Reflection from the desk of the Pastor

The Third Sunday in Ordinary Time

January 23, 2022

Year C

The gospel of Luke begins with a historical account of the words and deeds of Jesus. Luke wants to assure his readers of the truth of these words and deeds. The events that Luke writes about are a fulfillment of God's plan. In the second part of the gospel, Jesus returns to Nazareth and, according to his custom, goes into the synagogue on the Sabbath. Jesus' proclamation in the synagogue sets the tone for his ministry. Jesus is handed the scroll and he reads a passage from the prophet Isaiah. Jesus tells the people that the passage from Isaiah was being fulfilled as they listened. The words from the prophet Isaiah are being fulfilled in Jesus' life. The spirit of the Lord came upon Jesus at his baptism at river Jordan. Jesus also preached the good news to the poor, proclaimed liberty to captives, set the downtrodden free, and proclaimed the Lord's year of favor. Jesus' ministry would consist of granting liberty to those that were in debt on account of their sins. He would set them free through the forgiveness of their sins. Jesus would also set people free by physically healing their ailments.

This passage from the gospel of Luke is usually read at priestly ordinations. In the Congregation of the Mission (The Vincentians), Province of Nigeria, the gospel is usually read whenever our students are being incorporated into the congregation through their vows. It summarizes the mission of Jesus and, in more ways than one, the ministry of the Catholic priest. May these words be brought to fulfillment in the lives and ministries of our priests.

We ask this in the name of Jesus the Lord. Amen.

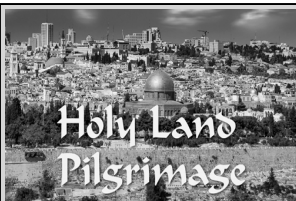
