A Reflection from the desk of the Pastor

The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ (Corpus Christi)

June 19, 2022

Year C

This Sunday we celebrate the feast of the Body and Blood of Christ. This feast is also known as Corpus Christi (Latin for **Body of Christ**). Though this feast has mid-thirteenth century French origins, it was extended to the whole Church by Pope Urban IV in 1264. It is celebrated on the Thursday following Trinity Sunday, or on the Sunday following Trinity Sunday in some dioceses. In celebrating this feast, we are called to focus on two manifestations of the Body of Christ: the **Eucharist**, and the **Church**. Our attention is called to the Real Presence of Christ in the Eucharist. It is also centered on the Body of Christ as it is present in the Church. The Church is called the Body of Christ because of the intimate communion which Jesus shares with his disciples. During the feast of Corpus Christi, we usually have Eucharistic processions as a sign of our faith and adoration. We should always approach and treat the Eucharist with the utmost reverence, mystery, and great devotion.

This weekend as we celebrate Father's Day, we would like to express our appreciation to all the fathers in our parish. Fatherhood is a rewarding, and sometimes challenging, vocation. Looking at the example of Joseph, the father of Jesus, we can see how rewarding and challenging it was for him to be the father of Jesus. Though it was divinely arranged, Joseph was not spared the human challenges that are associated with raising a child. We encourage the fathers in our parish to continue being the best examples they can be to their families. We pray the Lord to bless them and grant the deepest longings of their hearts according to his will.

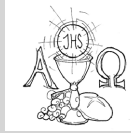

Genesis 14:18-20. Psalm 110:1, 2, 3, 4. 1 Corinthians 11:23-26. Sequence – Lauda Sion / Laud, O Zion.

Luke 9:11b-17.

About Dining in the Kingdom of God. Luke's gospel is filled with meal stories. Most of them point to the Eucharistic Meal, as does the one today. Four verbs stand out: take, bless, break, give. This is Eucharistic language repeated at every Mass. It is Jesus who truly took and blessed his Body and Blood – broke it and poured it out for each and for all of us – and gives to us to eat and drink – so that we may be like him and act like him.

- Because of my sharing in the Eucharistic Feast, how will I be a blessing to family, colleagues, neighbors?
- Because of my sharing in the Eucharistic Feast, how will I break open my life for the benefit of another?
- Because of my sharing in the Eucharistic Feast, what will I give away? If stumped, think of the mercy works.

The Miraculous Byzantine Icon of OUR MOTHER OF PERPETUAL HELP

In 1861 the lost miraculous Byzantine icon of Our Mother of Perpetual Help was found. Five years later, Pope Pius IX entrusted the icon to the care of the Redemptorists commissioning the Redemptorists to make her known throughout the world.

One of the first ten duplicates of the icon is enshrined at St. Alphonsus Liguori “Rock” Church on Grand Boulevard in St. Louis, Missouri. In 1871 that a novena to Our Mother of Perpetual Help was first offered at Rock Church. It was from St. Alphonsus Church in St. Louis that the novena spread throughout the world by means of the Redemptorists.

In 1922 the Redemptorists began offering a weekly devotion to Our Mother of Perpetual Help at the Rock. There were times, for example during World War II, that the City of St. Louis ran special bus lines on Tuesdays to Rock Church to handle the crowds of people who came to the devotional prayers. Many older Catholics who grew up in St. Louis testify to those days when as children they would travel by bus to St. Alphonsus with their mothers for the weekly devotions.

2022 marks the 100th anniversary when weekly devotions to Our Mother of Perpetual Help began at St. Alphonsus Liguori “Rock” Church. Like the original novena, weekly devotions to Our Mother of Perpetual Help also originated here at the Rock and spread throughout the world by way of the Redemptorists. For example, in Manila, Philippines, over 100,000 people come each week to the shrine of Our Mother of Perpetual Help for the devotional prayers.

Many parishes in the diocese have weekly devotions to Our Mother of Perpetual Help. That is why the Redemptorists want you to know some of the history surrounding the miraculous icon of Our Mother of Perpetual Help and join us in person or by means of streaming for the June 21-23 Triduum in honor of Our Mother of Perpetual Help and for a special Mass of Celebration June 26 (June 27 is the Feast of Our Mother of Perpetual Help) with Bishop Bruce Lewandowski, C.Ss.R. Auxiliary Bishop of the Archdiocese of Baltimore.
