A Reflection from the desk of the Pastor

Pentecost Sunday June 5, 2022 Year C

The word Pentecost means 50 in Greek. In our context, we are referring to 50 days after Easter. **Today** also marks the birthday of the Church and the beginning of the Church's mission to the world. **We** celebrate the gift of the Holy Spirit. Jesus had promised his disciples the gift of the Holy Spirit. Today that promise is being fulfilled.

Pentecost comes from a Jewish Harvest festival called Shavuot. The apostles were celebrating this feast when the events of Pentecost occurred. **Shavuot** marks the start of the wheat harvest and the end of the barley harvest. Shavuot also marks the time that the Jews were given the **Torah** on **Mount Sinai**. It is considered a highly important historical event.

What was significant about the descent of the Holy Spirit on the Apostles? When the Holy Spirit descended upon the apostles, they began to speak in different tongues, but could remarkably understand each other. They were certainly a diverse group with different preferences and ideologies. However, the coming of the Holy Spirit united them even further and they began to speak with one voice. There are different kinds of spiritual gifts but the same Spirit; there are different forms of service but the same Lord; there are different workings but the same God, who produces all of them in everyone.

When Jesus appeared amongst the Apostles, he breathed on them and gave them the gift of the Holy Spirit, with the power to forgive sins. This same act of breathing was done at creation by God. God blew into the nostrils of man, the breath of life.

The Miraculous Byzantine Icon of OUR MOTHER OF PERPETUAL HELP

In 1861 the lost miraculous Byzantine icon of Our Mother of Perpetual Help was found. Five years later, Pope Pius IX entrusted the icon to the care of the Redemptorists commissioning the Redemptorists to make her known throughout the world.

One of the first ten duplicates of the icon is enshrined at St. Alphonsus Liguori “Rock” Church on Grand Boulevard in St. Louis, Missouri. In 1871 that a novena to Our Mother of Perpetual Help was first offered at Rock Church. It was from St. Alphonsus Church in St. Louis that the novena spread throughout the world by means of the Redemptorists.

In 1922 the Redemptorists began offering a weekly devotion to Our Mother of Perpetual Help at the Rock. There were times, for example during World War II, that the City of St. Louis ran special bus lines on Tuesdays to Rock Church to handle the crowds of people who came to the devotional prayers. Many older Catholics who grew up in St. Louis testify to those days when as children they would travel by bus to St. Alphonsus with their mothers for the weekly devotions.

2022 marks the 100th anniversary when weekly devotions to Our Mother of Perpetual Help began at St. Alphonsus Liguori “Rock” Church. Like the original novena, weekly devotions to Our Mother of Perpetual Help also originated here at the Rock and spread throughout the world by way of the Redemptorists. For example, in Manila, Philippines, over 100,000 people come each week to the shrine of Our Mother of Perpetual Help for the devotional prayers.

Many parishes in the diocese have weekly devotions to Our Mother of Perpetual Help. That is why the Redemptorists want you to know some of the history surrounding the miraculous icon of Our Mother of Perpetual Help and join us in person or by means of streaming for the June 21-23 Triduum in honor of Our Mother of Perpetual Help and for a special Mass of Celebration June 26 (June 27 is the Feast of Our Mother of Perpetual Help) with Bishop Bruce Lewandowski, C.Ss.R. Auxiliary Bishop of the Archdiocese of Baltimore.
