A Reflection from the desk of the Pastor

Second Sunday of Lent

March 13, 2022

Year C

The Transfiguration of Jesus sheds light on Jesus' journey to the cross. The transfiguration occurs shortly after Jesus' announcement of his passion. Jesus takes the members of his inner circle (Peter, James, and John) with him up the mountain. As Jesus is transfigured in their presence, Moses and Elijah also appear to the apostles. Moses and Elijah were great figures in the Old Testament. Elijah was one of the greatest Old Testament prophets while Moses was representative of the Law. Peter is so overwhelmed that he offers to build three tents for Jesus, Moses, and Elijah. Perhaps, Peter did not want to ever leave their presence. He wants to prolong the experience for as long as possible. He is caught up in the moment and may not have realized the true impact of Jesus' prophecy of his passion. He also may not have understood the fact that Jesus' glory would only be accomplished through the wood of the cross. At the transfiguration God declares to the disciples, that Jesus is his beloved son. He asks them to listen to him. Perhaps, during this Lenten season, we can examine ourselves on how often we listen to the voice of Jesus. Do we listen to Jesus especially in the context of the prophecy of his passion? Do we listen to Jesus when we encounter our own passions and crosses? The cross is an inevitable part of our Christian journey. Let us learn to embrace our crosses with courage and strength. Peace be with you always.

Lenten Abstinence and Fasting Regulations

Everyone 14 years of age or older is bound to **abstain from meat** (and items made with meat) on **Ash Wednesday, all the Fridays of**

Lent and Good Friday.

Everyone 18 or older, and under 59 years of age, is bound to **fast** on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Only one full meatless meal is allowed. Two other meatless meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to each one’s needs, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted. When health or ability to work would be seriously affected, the law does not oblige. Catholics should not lightly excuse themselves from these prescribed minimal penitential practices. 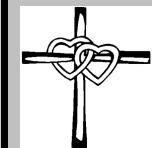
