A Reflection from the desk of the Pastor

Third Sunday of Lent

March 20, 2022

Year C

In the gospel, Jesus received the news that Pilate had killed the Galileans when they went to Jerusalem to offer sacrifices. Jesus tells the people that the Galileans did not die because of their sins. It was common, at the time, to attribute a person's misfortune to their sinfulness. Jesus then warns the people to repent or be prepared to experience the same fate as those who had died tragically.

Next, Jesus uses the image of the fig tree to illustrate the urgency of his message of repentance. I personally love the application of the parable of the fig tree. Just as the owner waits patiently to see if the fig tree will bear fruit, God waits patiently to give us a chance to repent. However, if we fail to repent, we might be "cut down" like the fig tree in the parable. Notice that the gardener intervened on behalf of the fig tree. He asked for more time to fertilize the land where the fig tree grew. How often has Jesus intervened on our behalf before the Father? The master gardener has fertilized us. Are we producing the desired fruit? Let us use the opportunities provided for us during the season of Lent for reconciliation with God and with our brothers and sisters.

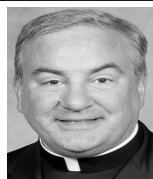

Lenten Abstinence and Fasting Regulations

Everyone 14 years of age or older is bound to **abstain from meat** (and items made with meat) on **Ash Wednesday, all the Fridays of Lent and Good Friday.**

Lent and Good Friday.

Everyone 18 or older, and under 59 years of age, is bound to **fast** on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Only one full meatless meal is allowed. Two other meatless meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to each one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted. When health or ability to work would be seriously affected, the law does not oblige. Catholics should not lightly excuse themselves from these prescribed minimal penitential practices.
