A Reflection from the desk of the Pastor

Fifth Sunday of Easter May 15, 2022 Year C

The gospel this Sunday constitutes part of what we know as the farewell discourse. It contains some of the departing words of Jesus to his disciples before he leaves them and goes to the Father. Jesus is concerned about his disciples' life following his resurrection and ascension. Jesus then gives his disciples a new commandment: **love one another**. Jesus gives them a model of love as he tells them to love each other as he has loved them. How did Jesus show his love for them? Jesus gave himself for the salvation of the world. He did this in obedience to the Father's will. He laid down his life for his friends. So, Jesus is asking his disciples to follow his example. How can we apply Jesus' command to ourselves? We are also called to one another following Jesus' model of love. We should give ourselves generously to others, expecting nothing in return. People will identify us as Christians by our love for one another.

In preparation for the upcoming synod, Pope Francis has called the entire People of God to journey together. This Synod is not just another meeting with oral presentations and written reports. This Synod is a process of journeying together. As the Church, we will listen to each other, dialogue with each other, pray together, discern together, and make decisions together for the purpose of proclaiming the Gospel of Jesus Christ to the World!

Here are the questions and topics that will be discussed at the Synod Listening Session – A Synodal Church, in announcing the Gospel, “journeys together.” How is this “journeying together” happening in your parish today? How is the Holy Spirit inviting your parish community to grow in “journeying together”? Jesus Christ – What is there about Jesus that draws me to him? What is there about Jesus that makes an impression on me? What is there about Jesus that I would like to share with my family, my neighbors, and the wider community? The Church – What is there about the Church that draws me closer to the Lord and to other people?

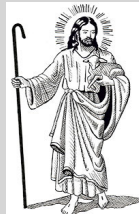

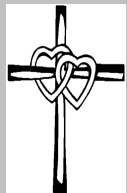

Fifth Sunday of Easter – 15 May 2022

Acts 14:21-27. Psalm 145:8-9, 10-11, 12-13. Revelation 21:1-5a. John 13:31-33a, 34-35

Loving One Another. The gospel today is short and sweet. Glorify God – Jesus does it first and implies we should, too. Love one another – a direct comma to each one of us. These are disciple activities. These are essentials for our way of life.

- How will my words and actions glorify God today?
- Whom will I love – even someone who makes it hard for me to do so?
- How will this glorifying God and loving others change me for the better?

Obligation to Attend Sunday Mass

Just to reiterate the Bishop's letter dated March 19, 2022...My predecessor, Bishop Edward Braxton, dispensed the faithful from this obligation in the Diocese of Belleville in March 2020. Now twenty-four months later, as our society and the Church have taken many measures to promote the health of the public, we have reached a point where we believe that we can reintroduce the obligation to attend Sunday Mass in a way that balances our health and safety concerns with the deep desire to meet the Lord Jesus and our sisters and brothers during the celebration of the Holy Eucharist in our churches, chapels and institutions. Therefore, on Sunday April 10, Palm Sunday, I will lift the dispensation and reintroduce the obligation to attend Sunday Mass for our Catholic community in southern Illinois. For many people who have continued to participate at Mass via social communication, I encourage you to see this step as an invitation to return to our parishes as we begin Holy Week. How fitting it is that we should gather around the altar of the Lord in church as we celebrate the mysteries of our salvation in Christ. For those who are sick, homebound, or gravely concerned about their health, the dispensation from the obligation to participate at Mass remains, as it has in the past during normal times. No one is morally obligated to attend Mass when doing so presents a grave risk to their health or the health of others. Please share this information with your family members and friends; I hope this is a moment when we can each offer a personal invitation to our families and neighbors to re-engage in the Eucharist at our parishes. When Jesus instituted the Holy Eucharist at the Last Supper in Jerusalem two thousand years ago, he declared to his apostles: "Do this in memory of me." May the Lord's words resonate in our hearts as we move toward the holiest of weeks and our celebration of the saving mysteries of Christ.
