A Reflection from the desk of the Pastor

Third Sunday of Easter

May 1, 2022

Year C

In the first reading from the Acts of the Apostles, the apostles were given a formal warning not to preach in the name of Jesus Christ. They had been arrested multiple times and warned to stop preaching. However, Peter and the apostles declare boldly that obedience to God comes before obedience to men. They blame the high priest and the elders for the death of Jesus. This time, the apostles speak with remarkable courage. They are no longer afraid of losing their lives or of being punished on account of Jesus. The apostles also feel honored that they had the privilege of suffering humiliation because of the Risen Lord. Their attitude is quite impressive when we consider the fact that they all abandoned Jesus during his passion and death. At the time, they were scared for their lives. Now, they are happy to suffer for Jesus. No intimidation from the high priest and the elders can prevent them from speaking boldly about the resurrection. Notice, too, that God protected the apostles from harm whenever their lives were threatened.

We can learn something from the experience of the of the apostles. Perhaps we can emulate their courageous attitude by speaking boldly against injustice and oppression in the world.

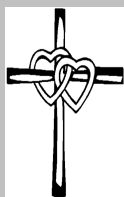
