A Reflection from the desk of the Pastor

The Ascension of the Lord

May 29, 2022

Year C

The Solemnity of the Ascension is celebrated 40 days after Easter. Although this celebration falls on a Thursday (Ascension Thursday), several dioceses in the United States and around the world celebrate the Ascension on the Sunday following Ascension Thursday. The Ascension is also the second Glorious Mystery of the Rosary. Do you know the other Glorious mysteries?

The Paschal mystery of Jesus Christ culminates in his Ascension into heaven. This occurred after Jesus' post-resurrection appearances to the disciples and his instructions to the apostles whom he had chosen. Jesus prepared his disciples for his ascension on several occasions in the context of his discussions with them. During the Ascension, Jesus was lifted up in a cloud and taken from their sight. (See Acts 1:9) With Christ's ascension, we are reminded of how Jesus' humanity entered into God's heavenly domain, from where he will come again. Through his ascension, Jesus precedes us to heaven, to his Father's kingdom, where we hope to join him in glory. Prior to his ascension, Jesus promised that the Father would send the Holy Spirit, the Advocate, the Paraclete, to be with his disciples and lead them to the complete truth. He did not want to leave them as orphans. Let us pray for the outpouring of the Holy Spirit in the Church during our celebration of Pentecost next weekend. May the Holy Spirit guide us and lead us to the complete truth as Jesus prayed.

As we mark Memorial Day on May 30th, please continue to pray for the repose of the souls of the brave men and women who died in service to the country. May the Lord grant eternal rest to their souls, Amen.

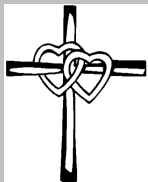

The Miraculous Byzantine Icon of OUR MOTHER OF PERPETUAL HELP

In 1861 the lost miraculous Byzantine icon of Our Mother of Perpetual Help was found. Five years later, Pope Pius IX entrusted the icon to the care of the Redemptorists commissioning the Redemptorists to make her known throughout the world.

One of the first ten duplicates of the icon is enshrined at St. Alphonsus Liguori “Rock” Church on Grand Boulevard in St. Louis, Missouri. In 1871 that a novena to Our Mother of Perpetual Help was first offered at Rock Church. It was from St. Alphonsus Church in St. Louis that the novena spread throughout the world by means of the Redemptorists.

In 1922 the Redemptorists began offering a weekly devotion to Our Mother of Perpetual Help at the Rock. There were times, for example during World War II, that the City of St. Louis ran special bus lines on Tuesdays to Rock Church to handle the crowds of people who came to the devotional prayers. Many older Catholics who grew up in St. Louis testify to those days when as children they would travel by bus to St. Alphonsus with their mothers for the weekly devotions.

2022 marks the 100th anniversary when weekly devotions to Our Mother of Perpetual Help began at St. Alphonsus Liguori “Rock” Church. Like the original novena, weekly devotions to Our Mother of Perpetual Help also originated here at the Rock and spread throughout the world by way of the Redemptorists. For example, in Manila, Philippines, over 100,000 people come each week to the shrine of Our Mother of Perpetual Help for the devotional prayers.

Many parishes in the diocese have weekly devotions to Our Mother of Perpetual Help. That is why the Redemptorists want you to know some of the history surrounding the miraculous icon of Our Mother of Perpetual Help and join us in person or by means of streaming for the June 21-23 Triduum in honor of Our Mother of Perpetual Help and for a special Mass of Celebration June 26 (June 27 is the Feast of Our Mother of Perpetual Help) with Bishop Bruce Lewandowski, C.Ss.R. Auxiliary Bishop of the Archdiocese of Baltimore.
