A Reflection from the desk of the Pastor

Fourth Sunday of Easter Good Shepherd Sunday May 8, 2022 Year C

Each year, on the Fourth Sunday of Easter, we celebrate Good Shepherd Sunday. In the gospel, Jesus describes himself as the Good Shepherd who lays down his life for his sheep. Jesus also makes a comparison with the hired hand. The hired hand abandons the sheep when his life and the lives of his sheep are threatened. Jesus speaks of the intimate relationship that exists between the Good Shepherd and his sheep. It is like the relationship between Jesus and the Father. This was such a unique relationship that it was uncommon to even imagine. The good shepherd was intimately connected to his sheep that he knew them by name, and they recognized his voice. Most of all, it was a relationship that was based on true love. Only true love can cause the shepherd to sacrifice his life for the sheep entrusted to his care. Jesus is indeed the Good Shepherd. He knows each of us by name and has sacrificed his life for our salvation. What greater act of love could we desire from a friend like Jesus?

On Good Shepherd Sunday, we also mark the World Day of Prayer for Vocations. We are called to pray publicly fulfill Jesus' instruction to his disciples to ask the Lord of the harvest to send laborers into his harvest. While we cherish all vocations, we are called on this day, to pray for vocations to the Priesthood, the Permanent Diaconate, the Consecrated Life in all its forms (male and female religious life, societies of apostolic life (like the Vincentians), consecrated virginity, and secular institutes in their diversity. We need more of these vocations. Please take time to pray for these vocations. 2022 marks the 59th anniversary of the World Day of Prayer for Vocations.

Happy Mother's Day to all the mothers in our parish. We are proud and thankful for your example and for the good work you do in our parish and beyond. May the Lord bless you all and keep you always in his love.

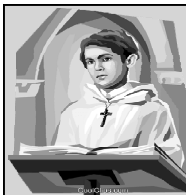

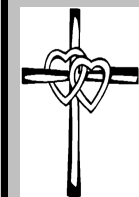

What Greater Gift Can You Give?

When someone passes away, extend them a Plenary Indulgence. It is so easy. If you received Communion daily, went to Confession monthly, and fulfilled the conditions stated below, you could release a soul to heaven everyday of your life. There is an army of souls in purgatory ready to help you. If you help them, they are especially anxious to help you. They cannot help themselves. Those who are released by your prayers and sacrifices are indebted to you and full of gratitude. They will be your prayer partners forever. Conditions for a Plenary Indulgence: Be in the state of grace; receive Communion each time a plenary indulgence is sought; go to Confession within 20 days before or after doing the prescribed work; have a disposition of Catholicism detachment of sin, even venial sin; pray for the intentions of the Pope, preferably one "Our Father" and one "Hail Mary"; have at least a general intention to gain a plenary indulgence; and fulfill one of the following: At least a 1/2 hour of adoration of the Blessed Sacrament; family or group Rosary; private Rosary before the Blessed Sacrament; or at least a 1/2 hour of pious reading of Sacred Scripture; or walking the Stations of the Cross in a church or with properly erected display of the Stations.
