A Reflection in the absence of the Pastor

The Sixteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time July 17, 2022 Year C

All three of today's readings are centered around service to God through differing ways. In the first reading from Genesis, Abraham eagerly serves God by taking care of three men. We are not provided any information as to whether the men are acquaintances, but Abraham sees that they need friendship, rest, and food. One could assume they are God in three persons as they tell Abraham that they will return in a year and Sarah will receive a miracle by giving birth to a son for their kindness.

In the second reading Paul tells the Colossians he gladly serves God through suffering to build up Christ's body, the Colossian church. By relentlessly teaching them everything so that they will understand they too can enjoy the gift of God's forgiveness and be joined in heaven with the chosen people of God.

And, lastly, in the Gospel message Jesus explains to Martha that Mary's need to hear the Word of God and listen to Jesus' explanation is far more important than preparing or serving a meal. By listening and learning she can become an effective messenger to serve God by proclaiming His message to the people.

We too, are called each day to service by God. By beginning each day with prayer and a scripture passage God may speak to our hearts, then as we go out into our world, we may be more open to His calling. Perhaps a person we pass each day and never notice suddenly takes on a face and voice. Today you may feel the need to stop and speak to them, hear their story and provide for them something they need. Whether that person is a homeless person, co-worker, waitress/waiter, or a family/friend who needs the compassion of Christ to lessen their burden and bring peace to their soul. Don't miss the opportunity to serve God in any capacity that he calls. Open your heart, eyes and ears...be the change. ~Joan Scharf

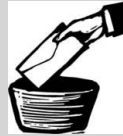

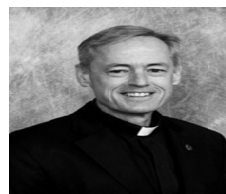

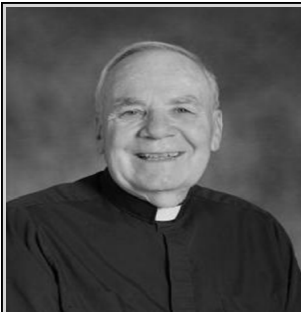

Monsignor Carl Scherrer Retires**

Little did I know what was in store for me when I was ordained to the priesthood by Bishop Zuroweste in my hometown parish of St. Mary's in Shawneetown on September 15, 1973. After serving as a transitional deacon at Holy Rosary Parish in Fairmont City and at St. Peter & Paul Parish in Waterloo, my first assignment as a priest was as an associate pastor at St. Peter's Cathedral in Belleville (1973-75). Then Bishop Zuroweste sent me to be the associate pastor at Blessed Sacrament Parish in Belleville (1975-79), & appointed me Diocesan CYO Director (1975 – 83). My first assignment as pastor was at St. Michael's Parish in Paderborn (1979 – 83), then Bishop Wurm sent me to St. John the Baptist Parish in Red Bud (1983 – 89). From Red Bud I went to St. Francis Xavier Parish in Carbondale (1989 – 99), and then Bishop Gregory assigned me to Corpus Christi Parish in Shiloh (1999-03). It was on July 22, 2003, that I arrived here as pastor of Immaculate Conception. All total, I've been in the ordained ministry for 50 years, one as a deacon and forty-nine as a priest.

As I retire from full time ministry, I look back with gratitude on all the wonderful people I've met in each of my assignments, and I realize that priesthood has brought me far more joy and happiness than I could have ever imagined back on my ordination day. Life as a priest has led me to believe with all my heart that "Life is beautiful," and "God is good...all the time!"

As I begin my "second half of life," I know that my part-time ministry as a priest will continue to be a source of great joy for me. **My blessings have been too numerous to count, and my friends are too numerous to name, but I will be forever grateful.**
