A Reflection from the Pastor

Eighteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

July 31, 2022

Year C

Vanity

In the first reading, the author speaks of the vanity associated with the things a person has toiled for. This is seen in the fact that the person labored skillfully and successfully for material things that would be left to someone who did not work as hard when that person died. The author thinks that no toil can win any worthwhile result. In the second reading, St. Paul tells the Colossians to strive for the things that are in heaven, where Christ is, rather than the things of the earth. He says they have stripped themselves of the old behavior with the old selves and put on a new self. In the new self, there is no room for distinctions between races, tribes, slaves and free people, Greeks and Jews, etc.

The lesson on vanity is summarized in the gospel. The story is told of the rich man who stocked up a bountiful harvest with the intention of taking it easy and having a wonderful time. However, he neglected to focus on what was most important. His efforts came to naught because he did not live long enough to enjoy the fruits of his labor. All that hard work was literally for nothing!

What lessons can we draw from the readings? We need to focus more on essential things. The material things that we toil for are not as important as the things of heaven. Interestingly, we spend more time and energy on things that do not last and are left to others who haven't worked for them. The things of heaven are more valuable and should be striven for. Otherwise, we risk losing the most important things in life.

What is First Friday Devotion?

First Friday is a devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus that was introduced by St. Margaret Mary Alacoque in 1675. "The prayer of the Church venerates and honors the *Heart of Jesus* just as it invokes his most holy name. It adores the incarnate Word and his Heart which, out of love for men, he allowed to be pierced by our sins. Christian prayer loves to follow *the way of the cross* in the Savior's steps. The stations from the Praetorium to Golgotha and the tomb trace the way of Jesus, who by his holy Cross has redeemed the world." (Catechism of the Catholic Church 2669)

The great promise of the Sacred Heart is most consoling: the grace of final perseverance and the joy of having Jesus' heart as our sure refuge and Infinite Ocean of mercy in our last hour.

To gain this grace, we must:

- Receive Holy Communion on nine consecutive first Fridays.
- Have the intention of honoring the Sacred Heart of Jesus and of reaching final perseverance.
- Offer each Holy Communion as an act of atonement for offenses against the Blessed Sacrament.

Bishop Michael G. McGovern announces the Bishop Residence in Belleville is placed on the real estate market.

The Catholic Diocese of Belleville announced today that the home used as the residence for Catholic bishops since 1948 is being placed on the real estate market.

The purpose of the sale is to generate resources that can be used for a maternity fund for expectant mothers as well as in support of Catholic education, youth ministry and evangelization.

Bishop Michael McGovern, who was appointed Bishop of Belleville by Pope Francis in April 2020, consulted with clergy and faithful for over a year, sharing his thoughts on selling the Bishop's Residence and using the funds for the Church's mission. Many priests expressed their support for selling the house. In discussions with the Finance Council, the President of the Council, stated: "The Council fully supports the Bishop's plans." When presented to the Diocesan Pastoral Council, their overall consensus was that Bishop McGovern should move forward with selling the Bishop's current residence.

Bishop McGovern will relocate this summer to the rectory of the Cathedral of St. Peter on Harrison Street and live in a suite of rooms in the residence for priests there. Monsignor John Myler, the Rector of the Cathedral, said: "The priests, people and staff of the Cathedral will welcome our Bishop. He has great love for and interest in the Cathedral. It will be so good to have him living, working, and praying with us daily!"

"I have prayed and reflected on this decision for many months," said Bishop McGovern. "I enjoy Belleville and think it is important for the Bishop of the Diocese to continue living near the Cathedral. I hope to live more simply and, as a pastor, I believe the proceeds from the sale of the home can be better used in helping pregnant mothers in need, assisting families seeking a Catholic education and providing programs for our youth."
