A Reflection from the Pastor

Twenty-Second Sunday in Ordinary Time August 28, 2022 Year C

In the gospel (Luke 14: 1, 7-14), Jesus tells the guests to do something that is opposite of what they are already doing. Otherwise, they may be forced to go to the lowest place. However, by choosing the lowest place, there was a chance that they might be invited to occupy the higher positions. Jesus emphasized the fact that everyone who exalted himself or herself would be humbled. Humility was one of the hallmarks of Jesus' life and ministry. It was Jesus' model for leadership. "The greatest among you must be your servant." – Luke 22: 26. Jesus also assumed the position of the servant several times during his ministry. At the Last Supper, Jesus washed the feet of his Apostles, a task that was reserved for the servants. Jesus showed by his example that leadership must be exercised with humility. Perhaps, we can learn a lesson from Jesus' example.

Jesus also had directives for those who host events. He asked that they extend an invitation to the poor, the lame, the crippled, the blind; in other words, the less privileged. These people are unable to pay back the kindness. Therefore, the hosts would be repaid at the resurrection of the righteous. In the world today, we are inclined to host those who can return the favor. That way, we can call in the favor sometime in the future. Jesus wants us to be selfless when we assist others. He laid down his life for us because he loved us. What are we prepared to do to show our love for our brothers and sisters?

Last Saturday, several parishioners and I were privileged to attend the baseball game between the Grizzlies and the Thunderbolts at the GCS Credit Union Ballpark. 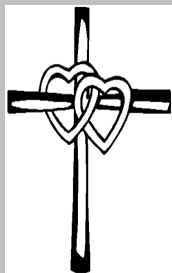

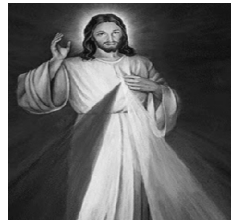

Child or Vulnerable Adult Protection Information

As a new School Year begins we need to be aware of contact information and instructions on how to report abuse or bullying. We are all responsible to protect our children and vulnerable adults. If you suspect a child or vulnerable adult is being abused or bullied here is a list of agencies to contact: **Important:** in the event of an emergency call 911. How To Make A Report: In the event that you suspect a child or vulnerable adult has been abused or bullied, it is important that you contact the appropriate authorities immediately. Please take the following steps:

1. Call DCFS toll free above, or if a child/vulnerable adult is in immediate danger contact your local law enforcement agency.
2. Follow your locations internal reporting procedure. Follow up the conversation with a written report.
3. Report all allegations of abuse (that were identified while in your employment/volunteer role) to the appropriate diocesan contact.



No child or vulnerable adult should have to live in fear.
