A Reflection from the Pastor

Nineteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

August 7, 2022

Year C

Last Sunday, the gospel focused on the vanity that is associated with material things, regardless of how valuable they may appear to be. This Sunday, the gospel focuses on something similar. Jesus encourages his disciples to strive for treasures that are durable and cannot be destroyed by moths. He also urges them to be dressed for action like servants awaiting their master's return from a wedding feast. The level of preparedness that Jesus recommended was necessary as the *time of the master's return* had not yet been determined. They were to be prepared because the master could return at any time! The servants that were prepared for the master's return would be rewarded while the servants that were not prepared would be punished accordingly.

Jesus' speech to his disciples is very relevant to us today. There is a level of preparedness that we must attain in anticipation of the master's return. We must put our affairs in order, to avoid being taken by surprise when the master returns. We have this false notion that *there is time*. This may cause us to put off our preparedness until the last moment. If the master's return was announced to us today, what steps would we take to be prepared? Those are the steps we must take today. We do not have as much time as we imagine. Now is the time for us to do the needful. Don't wait, or it may be too late!

Child or Vulnerable Adult Protection Information

As a new School Year begins we need to be aware of contact information and instructions on how to report abuse or bullying. We are all responsible to protect our children and vulnerable adults. How To Make A Report: In the event that you suspect a child or vulnerable adult has been abused or bullied, it is important that you contact the appropriate authorities immediately. Please take the following steps: 1. Call DCFS toll free above, or if a child/vulnerable adult is in immediate danger contact your local law enforcement agency. 2. Follow your locations internal reporting procedure. Follow up the conversation with a written report. 3. Report all allegations of abuse (that were identified while in your employment/volunteer role) to the appropriate diocesan contact.

No child or vulnerable adult should have to live in fear.

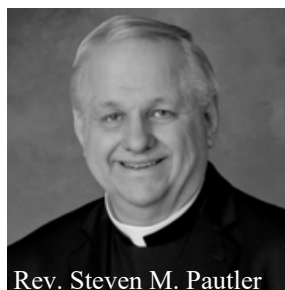

DIRECTOR'S REPORT

Greetings from the Office of Permanent Deacon Formation! Welcome to the first issue of “The Belleville Deacon.” This two page blog is intended to share with you progress of the Deacon Formation Program and to introduce prospective candidates to the Belleville Deacon Family. You will find important dates, contact information, prayer and just ramblings that may be of interest to you. You can find me at the Vocation Office, Building #2, Diocesan Pastoral Center, on Thursdays from 1:30 p.m. - 4:00 p.m. If you would like to meet with me please call the vocation office to schedule an appointment. The *Belleville Deacon* will be published the first day of each month. If you have something you would like to share with the community please email me. I ask you to pray for our entire diaconate community. We are blessed to have fifteen men in Formation. Nothing, however, can replace the years of experience and dedication of so many of the longest serving deacons in our diocese.

Called to serve - diakonos August marks the start of the inquiry stage of finding men who are called to the Ministry of Deacon. Formation of the new class for ordination in 2028 will begin with a retreat sometime in the month of August of 2023. The initial selection process for this class will begin with a series of “**Come and See**” events at various parishes around the diocese August through November 2022. Potential applicants should review the schedule above for the locations and dates of these events to take advantage of the opportunity to attend and learn more about the permanent diaconate and the formation program. Applicants must be baptized Catholic men between the ages of thirty and sixty (at the time the formation program begins), active in the parish, and recommended by their pastors. No pre-registration is required

Bishop Michael G. McGovern announces the Bishop Residence in Belleville is placed on the real estate market.

The Catholic Diocese of Belleville announced today that the home used as the residence for Catholic bishops since 1948 is being placed on the real estate market.

The purpose of the sale is to generate resources that can be used for a maternity fund for expectant mothers as well as in support of Catholic education, youth ministry and evangelization.

Bishop Michael McGovern, who was appointed Bishop of Belleville by Pope Francis in April 2020, consulted with clergy and faithful for over a year, sharing his thoughts on selling the Bishop's Residence and using the funds for the Church's mission. Many priests expressed their support for selling the house. In discussions with the Finance Council, the President of the Council, stated: "The Council fully supports the Bishop's plans." When presented to the Diocesan Pastoral Council, their overall consensus was that Bishop McGovern should move forward with selling the Bishop's current residence.

Bishop McGovern will relocate this summer to the rectory of the Cathedral of St. Peter on Harrison Street and live in a suite of rooms in the residence for priests there. Monsignor John Myler, the Rector of the Cathedral, said: "The priests, people and staff of the Cathedral will welcome our Bishop. He has great love for and interest in the Cathedral. It will be so good to have him living, working, and praying with us daily!"

"I have prayed and reflected on this decision for many months," said Bishop McGovern. "I enjoy Belleville and think it is important for the Bishop of the Diocese to continue living near the Cathedral. I hope to live more simply and, as a pastor, I believe the proceeds from the sale of the home can be better used in helping pregnant mothers in need, assisting families seeking a Catholic education and providing programs for our youth."
