## *A Reflection from the Pastor*

*Twenty-Third Sunday in Ordinary Time*

**September 4, 2022**

**Year C**

### **The cost of discipleship**

In speaking to his disciples, Jesus gives them conditions for discipleship. These conditions were not easy to follow, but they would prove to be invaluable for the disciples. Jesus did not necessarily ask his disciples to hate their families. Rather, in speaking figuratively, he wanted them to love him more than they loved their families. Our natural inclination is to be more loyal to our families than anyone else. Jesus is therefore saying that his disciples (we too) should be more loyal to him than to anyone else.

Jesus also asked his disciples to carry their crosses and follow him. Carrying one's cross requires self-sacrifice. The cross is difficult to bear. It goes against our normal tendency. We usually strive for things that are easier with low stress. However, Jesus calls his disciples to a much higher standard; that of embracing their crosses without complaint.

Additionally, the disciples were to consider the cost of following Jesus prior to making the commitment. In doing so, they would come to him freely being fully aware of the commitment they were making. Finally, Jesus asked them to renounce their possessions as a condition for discipleship. We sometimes rely on earthly possessions as a form of security. Giving them up implies that the disciples would now have to rely on Jesus for their providence and sustenance. Reliance on Jesus alone is quite challenging as it involves surrendering our will to Jesus' will. Although we say, "thy will be done..." it is difficult to accept someone else's will over ours.

What lessons can we learn from the gospel passage? We must be aware that there is a cost involved in following Jesus. We must consider this cost prior to making the commitment to follow Jesus. We also must be prepared to renounce our possessions when making the commitment to follow Jesus. Are we prepared to give up our earthly possessions as a condition for discipleship?

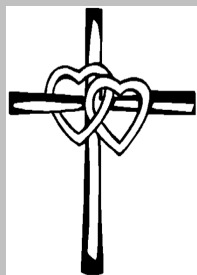
