A Reflection from the Pastor

Twenty-Seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time October 2, 2022 Year C

In the gospel, the apostles ask Jesus to increase their faith. They consider their faith to be weak. Jesus responds by telling them that if their faith were the size of a mustard seed, they could make the impossible happen. The apostles did not feel confident in their faith. They may have felt intimidated by Jesus' faith. Either way, they needed just a little faith to make things happen. Do we have faith the size of a mustard seed?

Next, Jesus tells his apostles a brief parable that illustrates the relationship between a servant and his master. The master's expectation is that the servant would perform his duties accordingly. The master is not necessarily impressed or thankful because the servant fulfilled his obligations. Jesus likens his apostles to servants who are required to fulfill certain obligations. After fulfilling their obligations, all they had to say was, "we have done what we were obliged to do." They were not to anticipate praise or commendation for fulfilling their duties. Like the apostles, we should not expect or demand commendation when we fulfill our duties. We can cultivate the habit of performing our duties without expecting to be rewarded. We must know we are servants and are simply performing our duties. In like manner, whenever we fulfill the requirements of discipleship, we cannot make claims on God's graciousness.

This week (October 3rd to October 6th), the priests of the diocese will be gathering for the annual diocesan convocation. Please keep us in your prayers as we gather for renewal, refreshment, and recreation.
