## *A Reflection from the Pastor*

**Twenty-Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time**

**September 25, 2022**

**Year C**

This weekend, I chose to reflect on the gospel (Luke 16: 19-31) which tells the story of the rich man (Dives) and Lazarus. The rich man had done well for himself and lived very comfortably. Interestingly, Lazarus, a poor man, lay outside the rich man's house covered with sores. Lazarus longed for scraps from the rich man's table but never received any. The rich man was apparently oblivious to Lazarus' need for food and shelter and did nothing to care for Lazarus' material needs. Incidentally, following their deaths, the rich man ended up in torment in Hades, while Lazarus enjoyed the company of Abraham. Their fortunes were reversed, and the rich man now required Lazarus' assistance to no avail. He tried to get Abraham to send Lazarus to warn his brothers so that they would not end up in torment like him. Abraham's response was significant. He told the rich man that sending someone from the dead (Lazarus) would not make a difference if they (the rich man's brothers) failed to listen to those who were alive. How do we treat the poor and less-privileged members of our community?

On Tuesday, September 27<sup>th</sup>, 2022, we celebrate the feast of St. Vincent de Paul, a saint who dedicated most of his life to providing for the spiritual and material needs of the poor and the less privileged. A significant aspect of St. Vincent de Paul's life is that initially, he wanted to live in a rich parish and retire at an early age. However, upon his *conversion*, St. Vincent de Paul committed himself fully to the welfare of the poor and less privileged. Today, St. Vincent de Paul is a household name that is associated with several charitable initiatives. St. Vincent de Paul founded the Congregation of the Mission and co-founded the Congregation of the Daughters of Charity, the Confraternities of Charity, and the Ladies of Charity. Please continue to pray for the members of these organization who do so much to alleviate the plight of the poor and the less privileged.

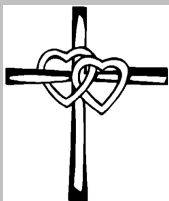

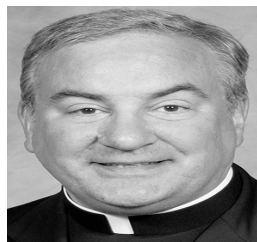

### Meeting Pope Francis

Dear Friends in Christ,

As many of you know, I spent the beginning of September in Rome for a seminar for 150 new bishops from around the world. It was a good conference, and I especially enjoyed meeting other bishops. Some of the bishops are in very challenging areas especially the five who came from Ukraine and about fifteen who are stationed in the Middle East. I was edified by all the bishops and their commitment to the Lord and the people.

On September 8, our group celebrated Mass at St. Peter's basilica and prayed at the crypt we believe contains the bones of St. Peter the Apostle. We then proceeded to a meeting room in the Vatican where we were received by the successor of St. Peter, Pope Francis.

The Holy Father invited the bishops to ask questions and he addressed whatever topics were raised. I enjoyed the Holy Father's words about how each bishop should be close to others and not be a distant figure. He encouraged us to be close to: God, other bishops, our priests and our people, the People of God.

A bishop grows close to God through prayer and the sacraments. A bishop must be a man of prayer, with time in silent prayer at several intervals of the day. There also needs to be time spent with other bishops for fraternal support. This could include praying together or making retreats together. The pope reminded us not to be isolated but in communion with other bishops.

The Holy Father also spoke at length that a bishop should be close to his brother priests. This includes being present at parishes, gatherings of priests and visiting priests who are ill. The Holy Father emphasized that a bishop should be available to priests when they ask to speak with the bishop and try to answer those requests in a timely manner.

Finally, Pope Francis encouraged bishops to be close to the People of God. The bishop should find many ways to draw near to people, especially in times of difficulty. This is an important part of being a shepherd to the Lord's flock.

I found great wisdom in the Holy Father's remarks. I was very pleased to greet him at the end of the audience, carrying all of you in my heart as I did so. Please continue to pray for Pope Francis, and for me. I look forward to the many ways we will grow closer to the Lord and one another in the Belleville diocese this year.
