A Reflection from the Pastor

Twenty-Ninth Sunday in Ordinary Time

October 16, 2022

Year C

Jesus uses the parable of the judge and the widow to emphasize the need for his disciples to pray without *getting weary*. The judge appears to be a sketchy character who neither fear God nor respects man. He would probably have denied the widow her rights had she not been persistent in her demands. The widow's situation dragged on for a while and the judge, afraid of being wearied to death, finally decided to grant her a just decision. Jesus makes a comparison between the dishonest judge and God. If the dishonest and unjust judge could grant the widow her rights, how much more would God grant justice to his chosen ones (the elect)?

The parable of the persistent widow offers us hope that God will answer our prayers. We may experience adversities and injustices in our lives. However, we are not without hope in God. On the last day, God's justice will prevail over all the injustices perpetrated in our world. If we put our faith in God and entrust our lives to him, we can look forward with hope and confidence. One question we can ask is, where do we place our faith and trust when we encounter adversities? Do we portray the same faith and persistence that was portrayed by the widow?
