A Reflection from the Pastor

Thirtieth Sunday in Ordinary Time **October 23, 2022** **Year C**

The focus of this Sunday's gospel is on the need to humble oneself before the Lord. When the Pharisee and the Publican prayed in the temple, the Pharisee spent time praising himself and condemning the Publican. In a sense, he bragged of his accomplishments before God. He even dared to claim that he was "not like the rest of humanity... or even like **this** tax collector." In essence, he made himself out to be a saint while inadvertently condemning the rest of humanity. He exhibited a holier-than-thou attitude. This was the attitude that Jesus condemned. Jesus remarked that the Publican went home at rights with God because he acknowledged his sinfulness rather than exalt himself.

In several instances, we have been like the Pharisee (exalting ourselves while condemning others). We sometimes think of ourselves as better than others because of our accomplishments, possessions, opportunities, or even our personal traits or characteristics. We must learn to be more like the Publican by acknowledging our sinfulness or unworthiness before God. When we humble ourselves before God, we will be exalted.

Today is World Mission Sunday. Please be generous in your contributions to support the work of the Church in different parts of the world. God bless you for your generosity.
