## *A Reflection from the Pastor*

*Thirty-First Sunday in Ordinary Time*

*October 30, 2022*

*Year C*

Zacchaeus was a chief tax collector, and the tax collectors had a bad reputation amongst the people. First off, they worked for the Roman government whom the people found to be oppressive. The Roman government collected taxes from the people. Secondly, several tax collectors extorted more than the required amount from the people, many of whom were poor. The tax collectors got rich and comfortable on the monies they extorted from the people. It was not uncommon, then, for the people to dislike the tax collectors. This attitude towards the tax collectors could be seen when the people were unhappy with Jesus for dining with the "tax collectors and sinners." (Matthew 9:10-13).

Zacchaeus had heard about Jesus and desired to see him. He was short in stature, and this proved to be a challenge because of the crowd that gathered around Jesus. To overcome this challenge, Zacchaeus climbs a sycamore tree to catch a glimpse of Jesus. Imagine his surprise when Jesus calls Zacchaeus by name and invites himself to dinner at Zacchaeus' house. During dinner, Zacchaeus makes a full conversion and decides to offer restitution to his victims. This was a profound gesture by a person who was thought to be a criminal. Jesus then declared that salvation had come to Zacchaeus' household. His declaration shows that it is possible for a rich person to enter the kingdom of God.

Interestingly, although Zacchaeus set out to encounter Jesus, it was Jesus who sought out Zacchaeus to save him and his household. Jesus is the good shepherd who seeks out the lost sheep. The good shepherd seeks us out each day. Let us emulate Zacchaeus' example by changing our ways for the better so that we can enter the kingdom of God.

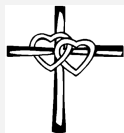

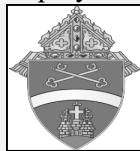
