A Reflection from the Pastor Twenty-Eighth Sunday in Ordinary Time October 9, 2022 Year C

In the gospel, we read the story of the ten individuals that were healed of leprosy by Jesus. These individuals had been ostracized from their communities because of the stigma that was associated with leprosy. Notice that Jesus encountered these individuals from a distance as they were not allowed to interact normally with others who were "clean". They addressed Jesus as "master" and asked for pity. Jesus directs them to show themselves to the priests who would declare them to be clean. Such a declaration would clear them for reentry into their local communities. It is by obeying his command that they are healed. This miracle somehow recalls the healing of Naaman the Syrian by Elisha (first reading) who was cleansed from a distance by obeying the prophet's order.

Incidentally, when they notice that they have been cleansed, only one person returns to glorify God and thank Jesus for his healing. This action, literally falling on his face, suggests that Jesus is to be recognized as a king. Jesus expresses his disappointment that the other nine did not return to give thanks after they realized that they had been healed. Incidentally, the person who returned to give thanks was a Samaritan (a foreigner). Through this act of healing, Jesus overcame the barrier between the Jews and non-Jews. Jesus also uses the Samaritan as a model of gratefulness and appreciation. This is an interesting development considering the strained relationship between the Jews and the Gentiles, and the fact that the Gentiles were not regarded as the "chosen ones".

In reflecting on this gospel passage, let us ask ourselves how appreciative we are, or have been, of God's blessings in our lives. Do we always return, like the Samaritan, to give thanks and glory to God?
