A Reflection from the Pastor

Thirty-Third Sunday in Ordinary Time November 13, 2022

Luke wrote this gospel after the devastation of Jerusalem by the Roman armies in 70 AD. Jesus spoke to the people regarding the certainty of the end times. He however warned them not to get carried away by false Messiahs or political leaders who claimed to correct the world. Jesus also warned them about the martyrdom that they might face which might entail betrayal by those they considered to be friends. They were not to prepare a defense during their time of persecution as they would be given an eloquent response that their persecutors could not match. Notice that Jesus did not promise to deliver them from all the difficulties and persecutions that awaited them. In applying this gospel to our lives, let us be aware that we may sometimes encounter difficulties and challenges on account of the gospel, like Jesus did. During such moments, we are called to endure and persevere. Our endurance will win us our lives. How do we cope in the face of persecution or betrayal?

Please be reminded of the Dupo Area Churches Thanksgiving service on Tuesday, November 22<sup>nd</sup>, 2022. This is a great opportunity for communal prayer and worship.




