A Reflection from the Pastor

Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe November 20, 2022 Year C

This Sunday, we celebrate the Solemnity of Christ the King. This is also the last Sunday of the Liturgical year. This feast was instituted in 1925 by Pope Pius XI to counteract atheism (the denial of the reality of God) and secularism (the general attitude or philosophical system that denies the existence and relevance of any values beyond those of the natural order). The feast does not celebrate a particular event in the life of Christ. It honors Christ's sovereignty over all persons, families, and the whole universe. The feast affirms the messianic kingship of Christ, who redeemed humanity by the blood of the cross. We celebrate Christ as king in two ways. First, we celebrate the messianic king, the one who has obtained salvation for all by his life, death, and resurrection. Through Christ, and in the Spirit, we enter the kingdom of God. We also celebrate Christ as the one to whom all persons and human institutions are subordinate. Our primary allegiance must be given to Christ and the kingdom of God.

This Thursday, as we celebrate Thanksgiving, let us remember to give God thanks for our families and for his blessings. God blesses us because he loves us, not because we can ever earn his love. Let us also spare a thought for the less privileged members of our community and assist them whenever possible. May the Lord bless you all for your generosity.

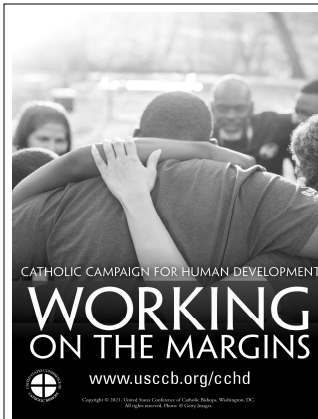

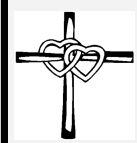
