A Reflection from the Pastor

Thirty-Second Sunday in Ordinary Time

November 6, 2022

Year C

This weekend, we commemorate the memorial of the faithful departed of our parish. We remember especially those parishioners who died in the last year. We would like to extend our condolences to the families of those who died within the past year. For some families, this loss may still be very fresh in their minds. It is indeed challenging to experience the death of a beloved family member. Please be assured of our prayers for you and for the repose of the souls of your loved ones. In this commemoration of the faithful departed, we are also reminded of our own mortality. The day will come when we must let go of our earthly lives. Now is the time to strive for what we want to achieve. One question that we should always keep in mind is: "What sort of footprints am I leaving behind for future generations?"

The story in the first reading is a notable example of courage, heroism, and faithfulness to one's religious practices. When the king tried to force the brothers to consume pig's flesh against their religious practices, they vehemently refuse. Although they knew the fate that awaited them, they were resolute and refuse to compromise their values. Their example is worthy of emulation. What is our response whenever we are "compelled" to compromise our Christian values? Are we courageous enough to stand by what we believe and practice? The brothers' stance resulted in the development of the doctrine of resurrection to new life. Instead of seeing the dead as having been confined to Sheol, those who died for the faith in the persecution would be raised by God to new life. By the time of Jesus, belief in the resurrection from the dead to new life was standard in Israel.

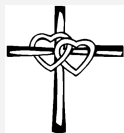

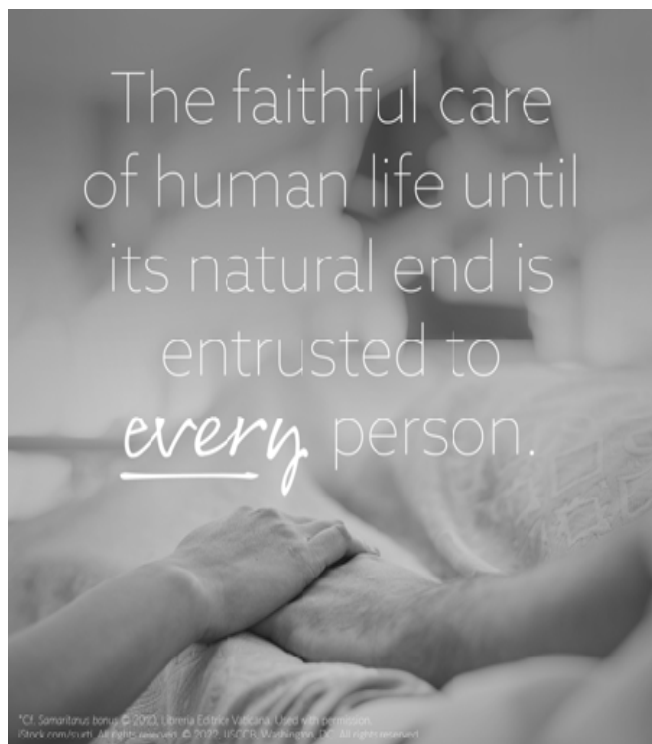
