Year A

Jesus uses two significant images to describe his disciples. He describes them as the Salt of the earth and Light of the world. Salt was (and still is) a very valuable commodity. It was used for flavor and for preservation. Indeed, salt is one of the most widely used preservatives and flavors today. By living the beatitudes, the disciples become the salt of the earth and they preserve the goodness in the world. The disciples who do not live according to the beatitudes become like salt that has lost its taste. I recall using a product that was fifty percent salt. There was something about this product that just made it very different from what I was used to. It appeared to have lost its taste and I kept increasing the quantity hoping that it would make my meal taste a bit better. It felt as though the salt had lost its taste! Needless to say, I did not use that product for very long. I am not, by any means, ridiculing this product. This is rather a reflection on the difference between my anticipation and my actual experience. The second image that Jesus uses is *light of the world*. According to Jewish tradition, Israel was supposed to be the light to the nations. Jesus then calls his disciples to be the light to the world by living the beatitudes. That way, the world would see their good deeds and give the glory to God the Father (Matthew 5:16).

Like the disciples, we are also called to be the *light of the world* and *salt of the earth*.

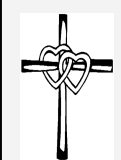

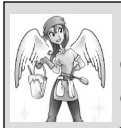

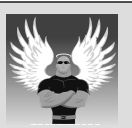

Faith and Poverty:

A Biblical Response Through Catholic Social Teaching

9 Consecutive Mondays Starting Feb, 6, 6:30-8:30 p.m.

This program explores God's call to respond to poverty in our local communities. Participants explore these two questions:

1. What tools does my Catholic faith have to offer regarding huge questions around poverty and injustice
2. In light of poverty and other forms of human suffering, what is the Good News of the Gospel?

This small group program will take place on zoom. Co-facilitated by CCHD intern, Tyler Timm, the program consists of deep prayer experiences, input from readings and videos, speakers, and group discussion using tools for respectful dialogue. 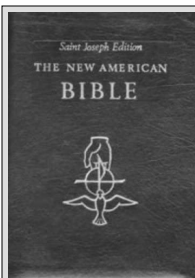

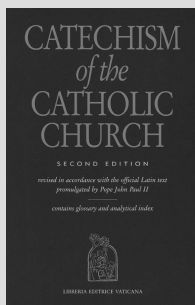

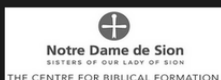
