Year A

The gospel focuses on the beginning of Jesus' ministry. There is some significance in the fact that Jesus launched his mission among the Galileans. This meant that the first Israelites to experience the darkness of having been in exile would be the first to experience the light of God's goodness.

In the second part of the gospel, Jesus calls his first disciples. These were professional fishermen that relied on their craft for their sustenance. Their response is radical and somewhat miraculous. They immediately abandon their craft and livelihood and follow Jesus. The only promise that Jesus made to them was that he would make them *fishers of men*. James and John not only left their profession, but also their father Zebedee, to follow Jesus. There must have been something about Jesus that captivated these first disciples. It may have been Jesus' charisma or his conviction that attracted these disciples to him. Jesus did not offer them anything material. However, they followed him without any hesitation, not minding their *losses*.

The response of the disciples is one that we should emulate. When Jesus invites us to be a part of his ministry on earth, how do we respond? Do we look forward to following Jesus unconditionally or worry more about our material losses?

This Sunday (Third Sunday in Ordinary Time) is regarded as the Sunday of the Word of God. The aim of the celebration is to give new life to the responsibility of all believers to deepen their knowledge of Sacred Scripture. The more familiar we are with the Scriptures, the more familiar we will be with Jesus. St. Jerome is quoted as having said, "Ignorance of the Scripture is ignorance of Christ." Let us always make an effort to be conversant of the Scriptures.

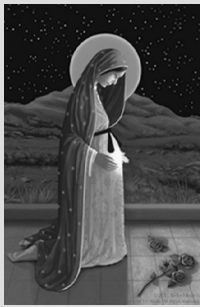

Just Faith Catholic Program Offered on Zoom!

Faith and Poverty:

A Biblical Response Through Catholic Social Teaching

9 Consecutive Mondays Starting Feb, 6, 6:30-8:30 p.m.

This program explores God's call to respond to poverty in our local communities. Participants explore these two questions:

1. What tools does my Catholic faith have to offer regarding huge questions around poverty and injustice
2. In light of poverty and other forms of human suffering, what is the Good News of the Gospel?

This small group program will take place on zoom. Co-facilitated by CCHD intern, Tyler Timm, the program consists of deep prayer experiences, input from readings and videos, speakers, and group discussion using tools for respectful dialogue. The program was created by Just Faith Ministries in partnership with the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops. A suggested individual cost for the program is \$35 and the purchase of one book for as little as \$6 used. Financial assistance is available through Just Faith Ministries.
