APPLICATION PROCESS FOR THE DEACON ORDINATION CLASS OF 2028 HAS BEGUN

Twenty-five men and their wives, representing parishes from throughout the Diocese, gathered for the formal application process to be considered as aspirants for the Deacon Ordination Class of 2028. This diverse group was comprised of men in their late twenties through their sixties. Potential aspirants and their wives listened to presentations about what to expect during their five year formation and post formation, when they will serve as deacons and deacon wives. Deacon Ron Pirau, from St. Meinrad School of Theology, who provides the academic formation, answered questions about the program. He also shared information about the Masters in Theology Degree that both the aspirants and wives can pursue. Applications were distributed and they need to be returned to the Diocesan Vocation Office no later than March 4, 2023.

DIRECTOR'S REPORT

"Beginning already in the early days of the Apostles, the Catholic Church has held in great veneration the sacred order of the diaconate, as the Apostle of the Gentiles himself bears witness. He expressly sends his greeting to the deacons together with the bishops and instructs Timothy which virtues and qualities are to be sought in them in order that they may be regarded as worthy of their ministry." —**Sacrum Diaconatus Ordinem Pope Paul VI June 18, 1967.**

The first deacon for the Diocese was ordained in 1970, and since that time, men have been called to serve God and the Church in various ways and ministries. Presently forty-four men serve as Permanent Deacons. Since the first ordination in 1970, the formation process for our diocese has evolved. In the initial years, formation was conducted by qualified priests and individuals from the diocese. Since 2003, the Belleville Diocese, partnering with Springfield-Cape Diocese have been forming deacons through the academic program offered by St. Meinrad School of Theology, St Meinrad, IN.

With joy, we begin the process of selecting men to serve as permanent deacons for our diocese. Many of them have already begun their journey during this pro-paedeutic stage, seeking out spiritual direction, meeting with their pastor and talking with family members.

The application process is a comprehensive collection of information that will help the Formation/Selection committee make prayerful recommendations to our Bishop for

consideration. In addition they are asked to select twenty-five individuals as personal references, letters of support from their wife, pastor and pastoral council. In addition, they must complete a complete medical physical and psychological evaluation. Please continue your prayers for an increase of vocations to the priesthood, diaconate and religious life.

Here we are in the early weeks of Ordinary Time and before you know it it'll be Ash Wednesday, Lent, Triduum, and Easter Sunday.
