Jesus states in the first part of the gospel that he has come not to abolish the law and the prophets (the entire Hebrew Scriptures), but to fulfill them. He is going to bring to realization the things that the Old Testament anticipated. In other words, Jesus is going to bring the Old Testament expectations to fulfillment. This fulfillment is brought about through Jesus' life, death, and resurrection.

Jesus also states that faithfulness to God's purpose for the law requires adherence to a higher standard than that which is expressed in the law. In some instances, a person may have to set aside his or her rights under the law in order to practice charity. The role of the law changed as Jesus brings out its deeper meaning. Jesus then uses three examples to explain what adherence to a greater standard means. For each of these examples (thou shalt not kill, the law on divorce, and the observance of one's oaths), Jesus begins by stating the current law and expectations, and then proceeds to present the higher standard. For instance, regarding the law against killing, Jesus states that one who disparages one's brother by calling him a fool would answer for it before the Sanhedrin. If he called his brother a renegade, he would answer for it in hell fire. In fact, Jesus urged reconciliation with one's brother prior to offering one's gifts at the altar.

We have a lot to learn from Jesus' words. We are also called to observe a much higher standard than that which is ordinarily required by law. It is not enough to simply say that we have observed the law. We have to go beyond the letter of the law to the spirit of the law.

"For the whole law is fulfilled in one statement, namely, 'You shall love your neighbor as yourself.'" Galatians 5:14

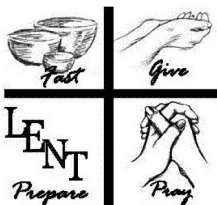

1. What tools does my Catholic faith have to offer regarding huge questions around poverty and injustice
2. In light of poverty and other forms of human suffering, what is the Good News of the Gospel?

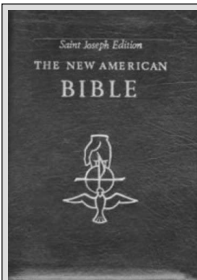
This small group program will take place on zoom. Co-facilitated by CCHD intern, Tyler Timm, the program consists of deep prayer experiences, input from readings and videos, speakers, and group discussion using tools for respectful dialogue. 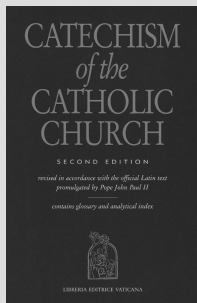
