Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity

June 4, 2023

Year A

Our Christian life begins in the name of the Trinity. At our baptism, we are asked to profess our belief in the Trinity. The mystery of the Most Holy Trinity is the central mystery of the Christian faith and life. It is the mystery of God in himself. It is therefore the source of all the other mysteries of faith, the light that enlightens them. It is the most fundamental and essential teaching in the hierarchy of the truths of faith.

The whole history of salvation is identical with the history of the way and the means by which the one true God, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, reveals himself to men "and reconciles and unites those who turn away from sin." By calling God Father, the language of faith indicates that God is the origin of everything and transcendent authority. It also indicates that God is at the same time goodness and loving care for all his children. God's parental tenderness can be expressed by the image of motherhood.

In speaking to Philip of his relation to the father, Jesus states that "to have seen me is to have seen the Father. The Father and I are one." Following the apostolic tradition, the Church confessed at the First Ecumenical council at Nicea that the Son is consubstantial with the Father, that is, one only God with him.

The Holy Spirit was spoken of by Jesus as the Advocate. The advocate would teach them and guide them to the complete truth. In the creed, when we speak of the Holy Spirit, we say "who proceeds from the Father and the Son. Together with the Father and the Son, he is adored and glorified.

In the Trinity, we do not confess three Gods, but one God in three persons.

Do You Know?

Catholics and all but four Protestant religions believe in the Triune God (one God in three persons); the Father, the Son (Jesus Christ), and the active force of their Spirit, the Most Holy Spirit? The four Protestant religions that do not recognize the Triune (tri meaning three and Unus meaning one) God; Church of Jesus Christ Latter-Day Saints, Jehovah’s Witnesses, La Luz del Mundo, and Iglesia ni Cirsto. The rest of the Christian faiths share in the mystery of the Trinity.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church 266 states, “**Now this is the Catholic Faith:** We worship one God in the Trinity and the Trinity in unity, without either confusing the persons or dividing the substance; for the person of the Faith is one, the Son’s is another, the Holy Spirit’s another; but the Godhead of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit is one, their glory equal, their majesty coeternal”-(Athanasian Creed; DS75; ND16). This is why we use the term “Consubstantial” with the Father in the Profession of Faith.

Someone recently said they did not understand what “One God in three persons” meant. The difficulty with trying to explain the mystery of the Trinity as three persons (The Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit) as distinct and unique persons, but as one substance is that our human state is limited to understanding the mystery of God. The doctrine of the Trinity simultaneously affirms both “unity of substance” and “diversity of persons.” - Culled from Encyclopedia of Catholicism.



Bishop McGovern's Response to the Illinois Attorney General Report

May 23, 2023

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

I am writing this letter in response to the issuance today of the Illinois Attorney General's Final "Report on Catholic Clergy Sex Abuse in Illinois". The Diocese of Belleville has cooperated fully during the Attorney General's five--year long preparation of this report by providing information about our clergy, living and deceased, and allegations of misconduct with minors that our Diocese has received. While I will need some time to read and fully absorb the AG's lengthy report, especially the section on the Diocese of Belleville, please permit me to share several important points.

It is crucial you understand that nothing is more important to us than the welfare of the youth entrusted to our care. The Diocese of Belleville takes all allegations of inappropriate or sexual misconduct seriously and encourages anyone who feels they have been harmed by a priest, deacon, religious or lay employee, to come forward. You may contact the Child Protection Hotline at **1-800-640-3044**.

I have today issued a companion document, attached here, entitled Diocese of Belleville's Response to Illinois Attorney General's Final Report (also at: www.diobelle.org). This document offers important information about our policies concerning child safety, including our commitment to appropriately respond to any allegations we receive about potentially abusive behavior by any of our clerics. I invite you to read this brief document and learn more about our commitment to safeguarding our youth.

In the name of our community, I offer my profound apology to all who have been harmed by the failure to prevent and properly respond to child sexual abuse by clerics. Furthermore, the Diocese is committed to providing services for the healing of victims/survivors of abuse by offering counseling and therapy that will assist them. Let me take this opportunity to thank all who play a role in helping us keep young people safe in our parishes, schools, PSR programs and activities. By following the child safety protocols, the training, and the required screening, we can continue making great strides in safeguarding the children entrusted to our care. If all our procedures can spare even one child from the horror of abuse, our efforts will have been well worth it.

Permit me also to affirm that we have hundreds of priests, deacons, religious, teachers, staff and volunteers who are dedicated to being good shepherds in our diocese. I thank them for their commitment to serving all the people of our community with dedication, care and respect. This Sunday the Church will celebrate the Solemnity of Pentecost, the great day when the Holy Spirit descended upon the apostles and disciples gathered in Jerusalem. Please join me in praying for the Holy Spirit to again fill the hearts and souls of all our clergy, religious and faithful of the Diocese of Belleville. May we work together for the renewal of the Church in southern Illinois.
