Year B

A dear old lady knew that she was about to die and hence asked her pastor to give her the Last Rite. After being anointed she said: "Soon I'll be rocking in the bosom of Moses." "No dear," corrected the pastor, "the Bible says the bosom of Abraham." She replied: "Father, at my age, you don't care too much whose bosom it is!"

First Reading presents Jeremiah's prophecy of a New Covenant God plans to make with "the house of Israel and the house of Judah". The Sinaitic Covenant was broken due to human weakness, but God didn't give up on human kind. Jeremiah talks about a God that maintains a friendly relationship with frail humans who constantly stray from the right path. While the Sinaitic Covenant was written on tablets of stone, the New Covenant will be written in human hearts. We find the fulfillment of this prophecy in the ministry of Jesus Christ. Unlike the traditional Jewish Rabbi, Jesus transformed his followers by his life and teaching. His mission was to establish a New Covenant. Thus, we see in Jesus the face of God's mercy. His compassionate love encourages us to keep making an effort to conquer sin and remain in friendship with God.

Today's Gospel narrates internal struggles Jesus experienced while focusing on the salvation plan of God. He struggled with his human nature resisting the desire for self-protection. He intentionally chose to glorify God in everything he did. He surrendered himself completely to the Father's Will and willingly accepted the consequences. Thus, he became the source of eternal salvation to all who obey him. Through his wounds we are healed. We see in him a friend who understands exactly what it means to be human. And he connects us to the father. He is our Covenant with God. Through him, we are able to relate to God in our hearts. This relationship is everlasting. Nothing is able to sever it. He loves us that much!

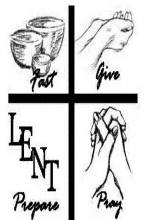

Lenten Abstinence and Fasting Regulations

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are **obligatory days of fasting and abstinence for Catholics**. In addition, Fridays during Lent are obligatory days of abstinence. For members of the Latin Catholic Church, **the norms on fasting are obligatory from age 18 until age 59**. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal. The norms concerning abstinence from meat are binding upon members of the Latin Catholic Church from age 14 onwards. If possible, the fast on Good Friday is continued until the Easter Vigil (on Holy Saturday night) as the "paschal fast" to honor the suffering and death of the Lord Jesus and to prepare ourselves to share more fully and to celebrate more readily his Resurrection. 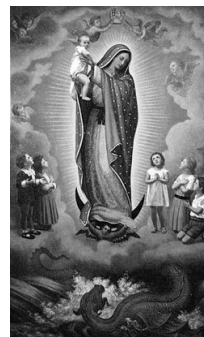

Every Life: Cherished, Chosen, Sent

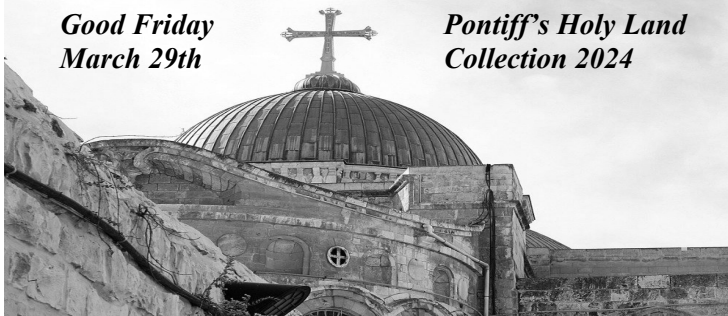
In 1531, when the indigenous peoples of Mexico were subjugated and the practice of human sacrifice was still a recent memory, the Mother of God appeared to St. Juan Diego as a pregnant native woman, now known as Our Lady of Guadalupe. She sent him with miraculous flowers in his cloak to tell the bishop to build a church where people could receive her Son and her loving, tender care. When St. Juan Diego opened the cloak before the bishop, an image of Our Lady was revealed that remains to this day. The chapel was quickly built, millions embraced Christianity, and the Church increased its protection of the indigenous peoples. By embracing the mission entrusted to him, St. Juan Diego helped bring Christ's transforming love to cultures gripped by oppression and death. Today, we again see the dignity of human life disregarded. Unborn children are destroyed through abortion, and ill people are encouraged and assisted to take their own lives. How do we respond? The essence of our identity is that we are created in God's image and likeness and loved by Him. Nothing can diminish the priceless worth of any human life. Every person is cherished. God creates every person for eternal union with Himself and continually invites us to embrace a loving relationship with Him. Every person is chosen.

We are called to be messengers of God's love, treating one another as cherished and chosen by Him. In doing so, we help build a culture that respects all human life. Every person is sent. Like St. Juan Diego, let us embrace our daily mission to help others encounter God's transforming, life-giving love.
