Are you being called to be a Permanent Deacon?

The Office of Permanent Deacon is considering starting a new class of aspirants in fall 2025. Eligibility is extended to men aged thirty-three to fifty-six by September 2025. Men older than fifty-six may still apply but require special approval from the Deacon Formation Office and the Bishop.

The formation process is a five-year commitment, including academic studies conducted by St. Meinrad School of Theology, spiritual direction, and learning about the deacon's role. Participants are required to attend a three-day meeting once per month over the course of the five year program. Interested individuals should first discuss their interest with their pastor. For those unable to attend the initial meeting, another session will be scheduled later. This meeting is an opportunity to learn about the process and requirements for becoming a Permanent Deacon in the Diocese.

ORDINATION TO THE TRANSITIONAL DIACONATE JUNE 1, 2024

We are pleased to announce that on June 1, 2024, at 10:00 a.m. Mr. Levi James will be ordained to the Transitional Diaconate at the Cathedral of St. Peter for the Diocese of Belleville. This joyous event marks a significant milestone in Levi's journey toward priesthood. The Diaconate, a sacred order in the Catholic Church, serves as a critical step for those preparing to be ordained as priests. Transitional Deacons, like Levi, are typically seminary students in the final phase of their training for the priesthood.

Following the ceremony, we encourage all attending clergy to gather on the cathedral steps to warmly welcome newly ordained (Deacon) Levi James into the brotherhood of priests and deacons. This gathering is not only a celebration of Levi's achievements but also a symbol of the communal support he will have as he continues his pastoral journey. We look forward to your presence on this blessed day as we support Levi's sacred commitment to his calling and witness his transition into a life of dedicated service to the Church and its faithful. A reception will follow in the McCormick Center.

MESSAGE FROM THE COORDINATOR OF DEACONS

MESSAGE FROM THE ASSISTANT DIRECTOR

Greetings in the Risen Lord! We are still in Easter Season wondering at the glory with which Jesus was raised from the dead. Psalm 2 speaks of this glory in this way: "You are my son, today I have begotten you" (2:7). What did the Psalmist see in order to write this? This Psalmist begins the psalm with his report on the plotting of the nations against God's Son (2:1-6) and ends it with his invitation to these nations and the rulers to learn wisdom and serve God's Son because of his preeminence and superiority over them (2:8-12).

Between the beginning and end, he writes prophetically these words: "You are my son, today I have begotten you:" that is, the Father tells His Son whom He is begetting since eternity but now laid in the tomb, that He has begotten him once again on the day of his resurrection ("today"). It means that the Father willed that the Divinity which is in the Personhood of the Son, dwells fully also in the human nature of Jesus Christ (Col.1:19; also read Ps.109). We do not know at what moment exactly the fullness of divinity was pleased to dwell in his humanity or when the Son's bodily resurrection took place? As it is sung in the Easter vigil, only that night knows in which watch and at what time the Father's begetting of the Son in his human nature (the bodily resurrection) took place.

When time permits, please read the Psalm 2 (also Ps.109) to enjoy the conversation between the Father and the Son which details the resurrection. On a personal note, keep me in your prayers as I am going to India for a short visit and will be back by June 7. God bless you.
