
MESSAGE FROM THE ASSISTANT DIRECTOR

The second Sunday of the holy season of Lent always presents the gospel of Transfiguration. The authors of the synoptic gospels provide their accounts. St. Mark provides his account of Transfiguration this year. Transfiguration is truly purpose-

ful: at the transfiguration, Moses and Elijah appear and speak to Jesus; among the Old Testament figures these two alone were blessed with an encounter with Him on Mt. Sinai. These two gave witness to the eternal divinity that belongs to the Son. The Father declares Jesus as "His Son." Peter and the apostles have the confirmation that Jesus, whom Peter proclaimed as "the Christ" (Mk.8:27-30), is the Beloved Son of the Lord God of Israel and the confirmation is given to them now when he is in His divine form. Thus they are given personal perception, experience and knowledge of His divinity so that they will also come to grasp, understand and then give witness to the depth and extent of self emptying of the Son. They would never be able to foresee, imagine

or understand "the self emptiness" of the Son without having this glimpse of his divinity at the Transfiguration. The gospel of transfiguration invites all in the Lenten season, especially us who are called to serve the People of God to align ourselves with the Son who became man not to be served but to serve. Our service to community is fruitful to the extent we have the followed "the self emptying of the Son" in our lives. God bless.

MESSAGE FROM THE DIRECTOR OF PERMANENT DIACONATE

When you read this we'll be a little past the half way point of Lent. "Lent is an invitation to rearrange your priorities—to focus on what matters most and leave behind what matters least. Lent is

the season where the Church prepares for Easter. ... Lent spans 40+ days until Holy Thursday. In the fourth chapter of Matthew, Jesus spends 40 days in the desert, fasting, praying, and preparing for his mission. Lent is your opportunity for that same focus. Lent is your invitation to take your spiritual life seriously. Lent is the perfect time to form life-giving habits and abandon selfdestructive habits. Lent is your chance to discover the abundant life Jesus invites us to at Easter.

Take these 40 days to explore God's dream for your life and it will change everything." (Dynamic Catholic) An important part of this is prayer (don't forget about fasting/sacrifice and almsgiving). If your email subscriptions and social media feeds are anything like mine, you have been inundated before and during Lent with requests to buy or subscribe to daily Lenten prayer and reflection aids. I have seen them from the National Eucharistic Revival, Dynamic Catholic, Ascension, Hallow, the Jesuits, Word on Fire, etc. etc.

but now many of them require a subscription or require/suggest purchase of a book. Then there are the monthly booklets that are available year round and that many of you, and your parishioners, use regularly - Give us This Day, The Word Among Us, Magnificat, etc. So as we near the end of Lent, and approach Holy Week and Easter, if you, or your parishioners, need help with Lenten prayer I recommend you avail yourselves to one of these resources. WHAT IS THE CLASS **OF 2028 DOING?**

On behalf of the Class of 2028, I want to begin by thanking all of you for your prayers and mentorship as we continue our journey tomation weekend, Deacon David Mills and Dea-Ministry.

Deacon Mills has been involved in prison ministry for a number of years. "I did not choose prison ministry," Mills stated, "prison ministry chose me." Deacon Mills helps to coordinate the, Prison Fellowship Academy where the incarcerated are inspired to lead lives of purpose inside outside of prison. This faithbased approach has proven effective, with less than 1% of graduates reoffending compared to a national rate recidivism rate of 68% according to the Bureau of Justice statistics.

Deacon Gary Mueller is also involved in prison ministry through, Our Brothers' Keepers (OBK) a faith-based organization committed to helping the incarcerated transition successfully into society. Mueller explained, "When they get released all they have is the clothes on their back. Our Brother's Keepers provides hygiene kits, transportation, clothes, temporarily housing, literacy, interview skills, and job opportunities." He noted that this assistance has led to a significant reduction in reoffending rates.


