A MESSAGE FROM FR. GODFREY MULLEN



Recently I announced to the priests of the diocese that Fr. Patrick McDevitt, CM, tendered his resignation from the positions of Chancellor and Director of Planning and Mission. In just a few months, Fr. Pat had directed more than a dozen listening sessions throughout the diocese. Happily, the notes from all those listening sessions will be reviewed carefully for continued planning. While Fr. Pat's departure creates a wrinkle in the forward movement of *Servants on Christ's Mission*, the original pastoral plan promulgated by Archbishop McGovern in 2024, which set the direction for the past several months, remains in force. The priorities of that plan remain important: ministry to youth and young adults, support of family life, development of faith formation, revitalizing parish life and ministry by growing God's family.

Soon, I will be engaging the Diocesan Pastoral Council, the College of Consultors, and the Diocesan Staff, among other groups, to discuss ways to maintain the energy brought about from the listening sessions and to plan a way forward until a new bishop is appointed and takes up this work. Your prayers are a very important part of our future. Your input remains vital to the plan God has in mind.

The pioneers of our parishes, people who left behind parishes they loved and founded new parishes when the time came, remain a powerful model for us and might rightly inspire us to ask what we might be asked to do, to offer, to sacrifice in the days ahead. Some have already faced sharing a pastor with another parish or two. Some parishes collaborate on important faith formation opportunities like OCIA (Becoming Catholic), religious education, and baptismal preparation. The challenge for all of us will be to envision a future that is filled with grace, a future of goodness that God has in mind for us so that instead of ministering to buildings, we will grow the family of God. During this Jubilee of Hope, we have every reason to hope. While there may very well be more sacrifices that are required of all of us, there will be so much more grace, so many more blessings.

May God bless our beloved Diocese and lead us forward in genuine faith, toward the Kingdom Christ established, the Kingdom we, as disciples of Jesus, are commanded to increase. God bless you all. Count on my daily prayers. And please pray for me!


