**Reflection for the Twenty-Second Sunday in Ordinary Time**

**Year C**


*After getting settled in the new town, a farmer went to church for the first time. He found that the people in the church gossiped and shunned him for his poor appearance. After the service, the preacher went to the farmer and told him that "In this town, we get dressed up for church." "But I am but a humble farmer with no better clothes than these. What shall I do?" "Pray to God," the priest replied. "He will tell you what to do." The next week the farmer came back to church wearing different clothes, but they were no better than the other set of clothes he had on before. The priest interrupted the service to berate the farmer. Didn't I tell you to ask God what to wear to come here?" "Yes sir, you did." "And did you do that?" "Yes sir, I did." "And what did God tell you to wear?" "Well to be honest, Father, He didn't know. He said He's never been in this church before."*

Our readings today implore us to think hard about our relationships with others in life. We have heard Jesus say in Matthew 5:43-48, "...Love those who hate you." It takes humility to love an enemy. Humility is a special kind of love. It reaches down deep in our hearts. In Luke's Gospel today, Jesus is trying to relay this special kind of love. He extends the idea that there should never be anyone who we feel is below or above us. Each person has a special place in God's plan for the world. I was once asked, "What do you think, are all the beggars on the street homeless?" Probably not, but I always encourage each person to prayerfully consider if they are called to give. For most of these people begging is a job. Not a job you may want, but one they have. If you give, look them in the eye, see the person the same way you would the clerk in the store or the server at the restaurant. There is a person God is inviting you to see. Even if you are not called to donate to them, say a prayer for them. Humble yourself to realize that they are as much a child of God as you.

At one of my favorite retreats we ended the retreat with an exercise on humility. Each of us had a large paper with our name on the top. Through the day we were invited to visit each person's paper and write down one thing that made this person special to us. We took the paper home with us and read it by ourselves. It is amazing how we touch others' lives. As you go into the next week, try looking into the eyes of others and see the beautiful reflection of God.~Joan
