The Thirtieth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Year C

Two Monks were discussing humility. "I have been praying and fasting, meditating and studying religion for 20 years. I have finally reached the level of humility. I am truly a nothing." said one monk. The other monk nodded gravely. "I too have spent my life devoted to serving God. I am also a nothing." At that moment a janitor passed, holding his mop. Overhearing the conversation, and feeling quite spiritual, he interrupted. "You know what, I am also a nothing." The monks looked away in disgust. "Who does he think he is to be a nothing???"


Each of us have encountered the poor. On street corners, in our neighborhoods, or perhaps even in your own family. As a Vincentian we are taught that serving the poor is a privilege. St. Vincent de Paul says, "...you are the servant of the poor, always smiling and good-humored. They are your masters, terribly sensitive and exacting masters you will see. And the uglier and the dirtier they will be, the more unjust and insulting, the more love you must give them." ([catholicexchange.com/the-lords-call-to-help-the-poor](http://catholicexchange.com/the-lords-call-to-help-the-poor)) However, serving the poor has to be done with humility. We have to learn to look at the poor. To look into their eyes and see their heart. Remembering you may be the only face of Christ they have ever seen. It means looking beyond their physical needs and seeing their spiritual needs. In the Old Testament, Sirach resounds God's love and justice for the poor.

St. Paul encourages Timothy in his second letter to stay strong so that he may see the Kingdom of Heaven. That will mean forgiving those who abandoned us at our time of need and being assured God never abandons us. Jesus' parable in Luke's Gospel today teaches us how important our humility is. Knowing that God does not have favorites, but addresses each of us equally. He looks into our hearts and sees the humility we extend to the least of His people. He sees our own need for His forgiveness for our sins. Take the time this week to notice those in need around you. Then jot down a few good things you noticed about them. Likewise, write down a few words that describe how their presence has shown you the face of God.~Joan

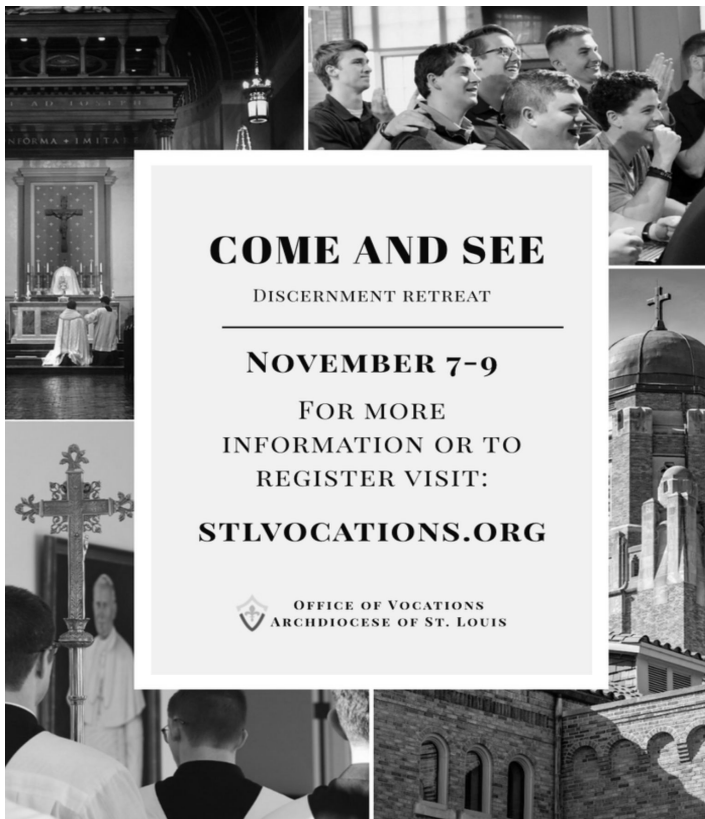
