Year C

A man was being tailgated by a stressed out woman on a busy boulevard. Suddenly, the light turned yellow, so He did the right thing and stopped at the crosswalk, even though he could speed through before the light turned red. The woman behind him was furious and honked her horn, screaming in frustration, dropping her cell phone and makeup. As she was still in mid-rant, she heard a tap on her window and looked up into the face of a very serious police officer. The officer took her to the police station where she was processed, and placed in a holding cell. After a couple of hours, she was escorted back to the booking desk where the arresting officer was waiting with her personal effects. He said, "I'm very sorry for this mistake. When I pulled up behind your car while you were blowing your horn, flipping off the guy in front of you, and cussing a blue streak at him. I noticed the 'What Would Jesus Do' bumper sticker, the 'Choose Life' license plate holder, the 'Follow Me to Sunday-School' bumper sticker, and the chrome-plated Christian fish emblem on the trunk, Naturally... I assumed you had stolen the car."

Patience is one of the seven capital virtues and defined by the Catholic Church as, "...a virtue connected to fortitude that enables a person to endure hardships with a calm and peaceful spirit, in conformity with God's will." (USCCB) The second reading from St. Paul to the Corinthians challenges us to re-evaluate how we see ourselves by God. We are not just a creation, but a purposeful creation. That purpose is to serve God with our whole being. In Ezekiel's reading, we are taught how God nourishes us with the life saving water of His word. This nourishment provides everything we need to proclaim the greatness of God and bear fruit for His kingdom. It is our duty and life.

So why did Jesus get so angry with the money changes and sellers in front of the temple? He was re-directing their view of what was important when worshipping the Father. They were not putting the emphases on what the Father values most, themselves. Not burnt offerings of animals. God wants us, our whole being present with Him in worship. Today as you worship, let God's greatness reflect through you and take that reflection into the world.~Joan
