Pastor Larson and his council president, Sven Johnson ended up in a heated argument over a seemingly minor worship detail. "I suggest we go home and pray to God to grant us peaceful hearts," said Pastor Larson as Sven stormed past him into the churchyard. After worship the next Sunday morning, Sven greeted Pastor Larson warmly. "I took your advice," he said. "I went home and said a prayer." "Great!" said Pastor Larson. "So did I! I prayed that God would grant us both peaceful hearts and a fresh start." "That's not what I prayed," said Sven. "I asked God to help me put up with you."

Do you ever wonder why God puts up with you? Or better yet, why did He make such an imperfect person? In the second reading St. Paul exhorts, "But God proves His love for us in that while we were still sinners Christ died for us" (Romans 5:8). God is not looking for perfection, just people who will listen to Him and follow His commandments (Exodus 19). Ten basic principles to live by or, if it is easier, two simple commands: Love God with all your heart, soul and mind and love your neighbor as yourself (Matthew 22:37-39). God tells Moses that those who listen to Him and keep His commandments will be His prize possessions, "You shall be to me a kingdom of priests, a holy nation" (Exodus 19:6a). We will be reconciled with the Father through our Lord Jesus Christ.

As we move through another week, let us not concentrate on our imperfection, but follow the examples of the Disciples and become laborers. Serving God in word and deed. Each of us has been given a gift so that we may serve God in our own special way. Go and give God's love freely without cost.~joan

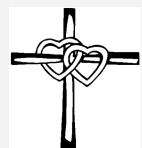

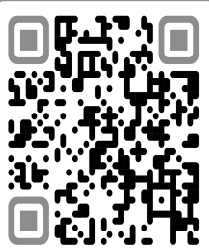

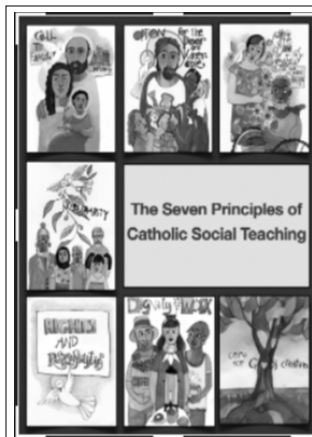
