Frustrated by his congregation's apathy, the pastor surprised the Altar Guild volunteer when he ordered that prune juice be used instead of wine for communion. "Why prune juice?" she asked. The pastor smiled. "If my sermons won't move them, the prune juice will!"

What a gift we are given! A couple of weeks ago we heard Jesus proclaim to the Disciples that He would not leave them alone. The Spirit of the Father and Son was given as an advocate. This week we celebrate another gift given by Jesus; a gift of His most precious body and blood. At the Last Supper with His Disciples Jesus invites them to partake of the bread that is His body and drink the wine that is His blood of the new covenant (Matthew 26:26-28 and Luke 22:19-20). After Jesus' death, no more would blood offerings will be needed. He is the perfect offering. The first reading from Deuteronomy tells of how God introduced the manna as the bread of substance. In the second reading St. Paul confirms that the wine blessed and the loaf shared are a participation in Christ's living sacrifice. Then after His resurrection He appeared to them, "And it happened that, while he was with them at table, he took bread said a blessing, broke it, and gave it to them. With that their eyes were opened and they recognized him.." (Luke 24:30-31). May today during the Consecration as the bread and wine are transformed into the elements of Christ may each of us recognize Him in the breaking of the bread. As we partake of Him may we feel the power of His love for us and use that love to be His living presence in the world.~joan.

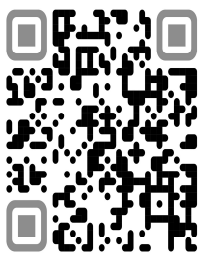

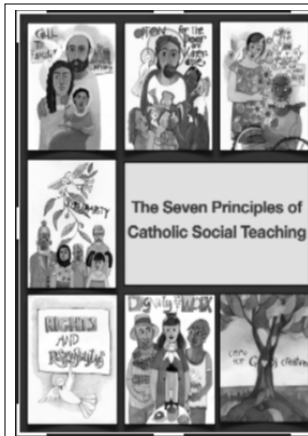


